This procurement will be a Request for Quote (RFQ) for the replacement of a new heat pump system and the removal of the old system in accordance with the specifications, terms, and conditions set forth in RFQ 24-19. To qualify to provide a Request for Quote, Contractors must be registered and active on the Municipal Research Services Corporation website prior to the Request for Quote due date and time.
